

PARK RULES

For your safety and the enjoyment of others, please observe the following when visiting Covington Parks:


- * Parks are open from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. or dusk, whichever comes first.
- * The following activities are prohibited:
 - Campfires;
 - Smoking and use of tobacco products;
 - Sales and rentals;
 - Signposting and solicitation;
 - Littering;
 - Alcoholic beverages and drugs;
 - Destruction or removal of park property;
 - Firearms;
 - Fireworks;
- * Dogs are permitted in designated areas.
- * Overnight Camping, aircraft and rocket launches are allowed with a Special Event Permit.

RESERVATIONS

Covington park areas and facilities are available for use by reservation for your special function.

EXPLORE COVINGTON'S PARKS...



CEDAR CREEK PARK
30 acres of Cedar Creek Park were acquired by the City of Covington in 2003 with the assistance of a Conservation Futures Grant. The park features high quality wetlands, creek, trails and diverse habitat areas. The additional 80 acres of the park is owned by King County.

CEDAR VALLEY PARK
26020 186th PI SE
The 6.75 acre natural area was acquired in 2002.



COVINGTON AQUATIC CENTER AT TAHOMA 18230 SE 240th

The aquatic center was acquired from King County in 2004. The facility contains a 25-meter indoor pool with water slide and room available for rentals. For scheduling and information call: **(425) 413-POOL**.



CITY HALL MULTIPURPOSE ROOM

Covington City Hall has a multi-purpose room available for rent. The room features hardwood floors and kitchen.



CRYSTAL VIEW PARK 25412 170th PI SE

The 2.2 acre parcel was acquired in 2000 and constructed in 2003. It was Covington's first park. It features a half basketball court, play equipment and picnic tables.

EVERGREEN PARK 19801 SE 262nd St

Evergreen Park was obtained from King County in 2000. When completed, the park will feature: A play area for pre-school children, natural area and walking path.



FRIENDSHIP PARK 15808 SE 254th PI

Friendship Park opened in 2004. The park is a converted storm water pond. The .6 acre park features a basketball court, picnic area, play equipment walking path and grassy area for informal play.

JENKINS CREEK PARK 18050 SE 267th PI

Jenkins Creek Park was transferred from King County to the City in 2003. The 23 acre park features: Walking trails and natural areas.



JENKINS CREEK TRAIL

The first segment of the Jenkins Creek Regional Trail was completed in 2002. It is located north of SE 262nd and East of 180th. The trail will connect the Soos Creek Trail to the Lake Wilderness Trail when completed.



180TH/240TH STREET PARK

This park is located at the southwest corner of 180th and 240th streets. 10 acres for the park were acquired in 2002 and 20 acres in 2003. The property features rolling pastures with mature forest and trails. A master plan for the park was developed in 2003. Construction is anticipated to occur in 2007.



164th AVENUE SKATE COURT 25064 164th Ave SE

The first City skate court opened in 2004. It features a 70 foot by 100 foot skating area with Huna ramps and web camera which allows visitors of the City web site the ability to view the park. Parking is not available.

THE RESERVE

The Reserve is a regional storm water facility. It has a maintenance access road surrounding the pond that also serves as a half-mile loop walking trail. There are benches, picnic tables and play equipment along the trail.



SOOS CREEK PARK AND TRAIL

King County operates the regional trail system through the park. The 183 acre park acts as an urban separator between Kent and Covington providing critical habitat areas.

UNNAMED OPEN SPACES

The City of Covington also owns and maintains several additional open space areas within the community as indicated on the map.
