

RESOLUTION NO. 15-09

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COVINGTON, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON, ADOPTING THE CITY OF COVINGTON COMPREHENSIVE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAN, FOURTH EDITION AS APPROVED BY THE STATE OF WASHINGTON EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIVISION

WHEREAS, the City of Covington passed Ordinance No. 85-98 establishing a Department of Emergency Management for the purpose of responding to any emergency that demands immediate action in order to preserve public health, life, and property or to assist in providing relief to the City if overtaken by such an occurrence and, in addition, to deal with any disaster of such a dimension or degree of destructiveness as to warrant the governor declaring a state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, RCW 38.52.070 and WAC 118.30.050 direct local organizations to establish operations of emergency powers and procedures; and

WHEREAS, WAC 118.30.060 requires each political subdivision to develop and maintain a current emergency plan and the plan shall be comprehensive in nature; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Covington adopted Resolution No. 01/12 on March 20, 2001, which adopted an Emergency Management Plan, and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Covington adopted Resolution No. 05-78 on December 13, 2005, which adopted the Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan, Second Edition, and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Covington adopted Resolution No. 11-01 on January, 11, 2011, which adopted the Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan, Third Edition, and


WHEREAS, the Covington Emergency Management Committee has exercised the existing plan, drafted revisions to said plan, and received acceptance of said revisions from the State of Washington, Military Department, Emergency Management Division; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Covington, King County, Washington, as follows:

Section 1: The City of Covington, Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan, Fourth Edition, is hereby adopted, and per WAC 118.30.060 staff is directed to implement, exercise, and amend said plan.

Section 2: Staff is directed to continue its state mandated efforts to update the plan every four years.


