3 TIPS for Hiring

#1 Check Online Reviews

#2 Ask for References... then check them.

#3 Ask this **IMPORTANT** question:

Where will you dump the dirty water?

	HAS A TANK	HAS NO TANK
RIGHT	<p>At an approved location</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • RV dumpsite • Sewer treatment plant 	<p>Into your toilet or other floor drain</p>
WRONG	<p>Anywhere except an RV dump site or wastewater treatment plant.</p>	<p>Via a hose into the street, driveway or your lawn.</p>

Why does it matter?

The dirty water can pollute our local waters if not disposed of properly.



Will you?

Almost **HALF** of your neighbors **said they will** likely ask their carpet cleaner! “Where will you dump the dirty water?”, before they hire them.
